**Hebrews 13: 5b-8:** . . . For He has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." So we say with **confidence**, "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can mere mortals do to me?" Remember your leaders, who spoke the Word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith. **Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever**.

**Psalm 86** [A Prayer of David]: <u>Hear</u> me, **O Lord**, and <u>answer</u> me, for I am poor and needy. <u>Guard</u> my life, for I am faithful to You; <u>save</u> Your servant who trusts in You. You are my **God**; have <u>mercy</u> on me, **Lord**, for I call to You all day long.

<sup>4</sup>Bring joy to Your servant, **Lord**,<sup>c</sup> for I put my trust in You. You, **Lord**, are <u>forgiving</u> and <u>good</u>, abounding in **[steadfast] love** to all who call to You.

<sup>6</sup>Hear my prayer, **O Lord**; listen to my cry for mercy. When I am in distress, I call to You, because You answer me. Among the gods there is <u>none like You</u>, **Lord**; <u>no deeds can compare</u> with Yours. All the <u>nations You have made</u> will come and worship before You, **Lord**; they will bring glory to Your name. For You are <u>great</u> and do <u>marvelous</u> deeds; <u>You alone are **God**</u>.

<sup>11</sup>Teach me Your way, **O LORD**, that I may rely on Your <u>faithfulness</u>; give me an undivided heart, that I may <u>fear</u> Your name. I will praise You, **Lord my God**, with all my heart; I will glorify Your name forever. For great is Your **[steadfast]** <u>love</u> toward me; You have delivered me from the depths, from the realm of the dead.

<sup>14</sup>Arrogant foes are attacking me, **O God**; ruthless people are trying to kill me — they have no regard for You. But You, **Lord**, are a <u>compassionate</u> and <u>gracious</u> **God**, slow to anger, abounding in **[steadfast]** <u>love</u> and <u>faithfulness</u>.

<sup>16</sup> Turn to me and have mercy on me; show Your <u>strength</u> in behalf of Your servant; save me, because I serve You just as my mother did. Give me a sign of Your <u>goodness</u>, that my enemies may see it and be put to shame, for You, **O LORD**, have <u>help</u>ed me and <u>comfort</u>ed me.

- 1. In the midst of our changing and challenging experiences, our adapting to circumstances and polarities of life, and in the transformations that are integral of our lives we can know and experience the steadfast, unwavering love of God. He graciously hears our prayers and anchors and draws up our oscillating lives as we worship Him and commit ourselves afresh to His service.
- 2. We are made to adapt, change and transform God is neither made nor is He at all like us in this respect. In contrast, He is our Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer. He is who He is, has been and ever will be and He acts accordingly, consistently, and lovingly with His unchanging moral and natural attributes.


#### We should Notice:

- Emotions: Fear of man and fear of God and nature of trust (stage-wise, past platform for future)

Adaptive Confidence and Warranted Hope: Drawn into focus by leaders (Heb 13:7), family (Psalm 86:16), awareness of need (Ps 86, 1, 6), fact of no one else (6), distress (6), people challenges (14). Drawn up to steadfast love through Spirit's teaching (11), servant-trust (2, 3), God's past deeds (13, 17), desire for signs & vindication (16), and remembrance of the enduring character of God.

#### Painting our Reality: Bit of Rocket Science and a Bit about Life






Pulse of Life: "If no ups and downs then there is no life"

#### Paradox of the Christian from: Incredible Christian – A.W. Tozer (Chapter 1)

The Christian believes that in Christ he has died, yet he is more alive than before and he fully expects to live forever. He walks on earth while seated in heaven and though born on earth He finds that after his conversion he is not at home here . . . That he may be safe he puts himself in jeopardy; he loses his life to save it and is in danger of losing it if he attempts to preserve it. He goes down to get up. If he refuses to go down he is already down, but when he starts down he is on his way up.

He is strongest when he is weakest and weakest when he is strong. Though poor he has the power to make others rich, but when he becomes rich his ability to enrich others vanishes. He has most after he has given most away and has least when he possesses most. He may be and often is highest when he feels lowest and most sinless when he is most conscious of sin. He is wisest when he knows that he knows not and knows least when he has acquired the greatest amount of knowledge. He sometimes does most by doing nothing and goes furthest when standing still. In heaviness he manages to rejoice and keeps his heart glad even in sorrow.

The paradoxical character of the Christian is revealed constantly. For instance, he believes that he is saved now, nevertheless he expects to be saved later . . . He fears God but is not afraid of Him. In God's presence he feels overwhelmed and undone, yet there is nowhere he would rather be than in that presence . . . He feels that he is in his own right altogether less than nothing, yet he believes without question that he is the apple of God's eye and that for him the Eternal Son became flesh and died on the cross of shame . . . He cheerfully expects before long to enter that bright world above, but he is in no hurry to leave this world . . . Incredible Christian!
