
# From Foolish Pretense to Wise Dependance Psalm 34

**Psalm 34 (NIV):** Of David. When he pretended to be insane before Abimelek [royal Philistine title] [Achish, King of Gath, Goliath's home city]. David is on the run. Written in and sung from Cave of Adullam. An acrostic psalm.

<sup>1</sup>I will **extol (magnify)** the **LORD** at *all times*; His praise will *always* be on my lips.<sup>2</sup>I will glory in the **LORD**; let the <u>afflicted</u> hear and rejoice. <sup>3</sup>Glorify the **LORD** with me; let us **exalt** His name together.

<sup>4</sup>I **sought** the **LORD**, and <u>He answered</u> me; <u>He delivered</u> me from all my fears. <sup>5</sup>Those who **look** to Him are **radiant**; their faces are never covered with shame. <sup>6</sup>This *poor man* called, and the **LORD** <u>heard</u> him; He <u>saved</u> him out of all his *troubles*. <sup>7</sup>The angel of the **LORD** encamps around those who fear Him, and He delivers them.

<sup>8</sup>Taste and see that the LORD is good; <u>blessed</u> is the one who takes <u>refuge</u> in Him. <sup>9</sup>Fear the LORD, you His holy people, for those who fear Him <u>lack nothing</u>. <sup>10</sup>The lions may grow weak and hungry, but those who seek the LORD <u>lack nogood thing</u>.

<sup>11</sup>Come, my children, **listen** to me; I will teach you the **fear of the LORD**. <sup>12</sup>Whoever of you loves life and desires to see many good days, <sup>13</sup>keep your tongue from evil and your lips from telling lies. <sup>14</sup>Turn from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it.

<sup>15</sup>The <u>eyes</u> of the **LORD** are <u>on the righteous</u>, and His <u>ears</u> are <u>attentive to their **cry**; <sup>16</sup>but the <u>face</u> of the **LORD** is against those who do evil, to <u>blot out</u> their name from the earth. <sup>17</sup>The **righteous cry** out, and the **LORD** <u>hears</u> them; He <u>delivers</u> them <u>from</u> all their **troubles**. <sup>18</sup>The **LORD** is <u>close</u> to the **broken-hearted** and <u>saves</u> those who are **crushed in spirit**. <sup>19</sup>The righteous person may have **many troubles**, but the **LORD** <u>delivers</u> him from them all; <sup>20</sup>He <u>protects</u> all his bones, not one of them will be broken. <sup>21</sup>Evil will <u>slay</u> the wicked; the foes of the righteous will be <u>condemned</u>. <sup>22</sup>The **LORD** will <u>rescue</u> His servants; <u>no one who takes refuge in Him will be **condemned**.</u></u>

# Back Story of Young David Fleeing Saul (I Samuel 21:10-15; 22:1, 2)

- On the run, foolishness, discovered, pretending craziness as means to escape
- Stuck in cave with 100 distressed, in debt and discontented others

#### Worthy of Our Praise: Blessing, Boasting and Buoyant Praise (1-3)

- LORD (15x) Jehovah or Yahweh is the covenant name of God. Occurs 6823 times in the OT
- Extolling (magnifying)
- Glorifying (boasting)
- Exalting, hearing, rejoicing

## The Great Deliverer: Experiences of Deliverance (4-7)

- Seeking, looking, radiating and calling
- Delivered from fears, shame, poverty, and troubles

# Our Good, Good God: Experiencing, Fearing, and Seeking YAHWEH (8-10)

- Taste test, seeing, fearing (reverent awe) and seeking
- Fear as wisdom and dependence (Prov 1:7; 8:13); taking refuge in the One who offers blessing, courage, safety/security and no lacking ('praise pays')

# Advice for Living from a Transformed and Grateful Pretender (11-14)

- Come and listen, fear the LORD
- Keep tongue under control (no lies)
- Turn from evil and do good
- Seek and pursue peace

## Attentions and Actions of YAHWEH (15-22) \*Notice Anthropomorphic language

- Deep care, sympathy, companionship for troubled, mending the broken-hearted, crushed, afflicted
- The gift of no condemnation: Acquitted by Jesus Christ (Rom 8:1)

**Essence of Today's Message:** Leave your pretending and start depending on the Lord Jesus Christ who is altogether worthy of your praise. He is Good. He Delivers. He is Great. He "gets" us. He is the great need-meeter; with Him there is no lacking. **He saves us.** He **has redeemed us with His Love**.

<u>Respond to His offer of salvation</u>. Seek <u>first-hand experience of His love</u>. Move beyond knowing about Him to experiencing Him. **Revere** Him. **Respond** in praise to Him. **Radiate** Him. **Rest** in Him.

## **Invitation to Respond**

We rest on Thee, our Shield and our Defender; we go not forth alone against the foe; Strong in Thy strength, safe in Thy keeping tender. We rest on Thee, and in Thy Name we go.

Yea, in Thy Name, O Captain of salvation! In Thy dear Name, all other names above; Jesus our Righteousness, our sure Foundation, our Prince of glory and our King of love.
