Genesis 1:26 (Also see Jeremiah 31:31-34; Colossians 3:9, 10; Ephesians 4:21-24) Then God said, "Let Us make man in <u>our image, after our likeness</u> . . . (NIV) or . . . God spoke: "Let Us make human beings in <u>Our image, make them reflecting our nature</u>" (Message Version)

2 Corinthians 2:15, 16; 3:1-18

Aroma of Life:

For we are to God the pleasing aroma of Christ among those who are being saved and those who are perishing. ¹⁶ To the one we are an aroma that brings death; to the other, an <u>aroma that brings life</u>. And who is equal to such a task? Are we beginning to commend ourselves again? Or do we need, like some people, letters of recommendation to you or from you?

Letter of Life:

You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, known and read by everyone. ³ You show that you are a letter from Christ, the result of our ministry, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts. ⁴ Such confidence we have through Christ before God. ⁵ Not that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence comes from God. ⁶ He has made us competent as ministers of a new covenant—not of the letter but of the Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life. ¹² Therefore, since we have such a hope, we are very bold.

Unveiled Faces:

We are not like Moses (Exodus 34:29-35), who would put a veil over his face to prevent the Israelites from seeing the end of what was passing away. ¹⁴ But their minds were made dull, for to this day the same veil remains when the old covenant is read. It has not been removed, because only in Christ is it taken away. ¹⁵ Even to this day when Moses is read, a veil covers their hearts. ¹⁶ **But** whenever anyone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. ¹⁷ Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is **freedom**.

Mirror Images:

And <u>we</u> all, who with unveiled faces contemplate/reflect the Lord's glory, <u>are being</u> <u>transformed into **His image**</u> with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.

Essence of Message: The start of a new year is the perfect opportunity to renew our appreciation of the promised "new covenant" which provides for the permanent, inside-out dynamic of the Lord Jesus Christ to actually live in and through us – He created us to so depend on Him as to reflect or mirror His image in and through our authentic and redeemed selves (Galatians 2:20). He willingly walks in our shoes, thinks through our minds and loves through our personalities. This relieves us of the impossible task of trying to glorifying him, as poor imitators, semi-keepers of the law, and ever-fading, easily distracted people – saves us from our exhausting efforts to mimic or look like Jesus by our own efforts. Various Images of the Christian:

- **Aroma** (attractive to keenest of senses; life lived as a continuous prayer): Am I a fragrance that attracts or repels?
- Letter (meant to convey a message): Am I living, "good news letter," a 140 character text, a quick tweet or small screen version of the real thing?
- **Veiled Face** (an unsustainable alternative): Do I have ebb, flow, good day/bad days, and fading issues?
- **Unveiled Face** (new covenant face with permanent presence of Christ in me, my hope of glory) True (vs False) Self, the authentic me
- Painted Image (an alternative): Persona, hypocrisy, duplicity, impersonation, sophistication but hardly sea worthy.
- Derived Image (like the mirror that can't give back what it can't see): Do I reflect
 the person of Jesus Christ who stands before me, my Lord and Saviour? I must
 avoid becoming dusty (unused), dirty (sinful), distorted (unshaped by Word but
 shaped by world)
